## FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION

If it's not your money, taking it is a crime.

Financial exploitation is the illegal or improper use of another person's money or property for personal profit or gain. Financial exploitation of adults who are vulnerable, elderly or disabled is a increasing problem and protecting the from becoming victims is everyone's business.

### EXAMPLES OF FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION

- Cashing checks without authorization or permission
- Misusing or stealing a person's money or possessions
- Coercing or deceiving a person into signing documents such as a contract or will
- Improper use of conservatorship, guardianship or power of attorney

### POTENTIAL SIGNS OF FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION

Changing account beneficiaries, sudden unexplained changes in bank accounts or banking practices, unexplained withdrawal of money by accompanying the account holder, adding additional names to bank accounts or signature cards. Unapproved withdrawal of funds using an ATM card, new applications for credit cards or banking cards, out of sequence check numbers, redirected mail, sudden changes in a will, property title, deeds or other financial documents, unexplained missing funds or valuables.
